Now, at the age of just 17, she is presenting a major CD debut for the Ars label. She is not making it among those relevant masterpieces that will always remain a challenge even for seasoned interpreters.

With a pinch of healthy theatricality, she lets the recitative-like bow in Maurice Ravel's Tzigane Rhapsody rise from low registers that almost resemble a viola. With this, the young artist presents her tonal calling card, scoring with a big tone and a flaming, yet slender vibrato. In terms of commanding precision, nothing is left to be desired here - including complex double-stopping passages, dazzling flagolettes, stretched, flowing intervals - so that everything comes across as sensual and not simply 'clean'.



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One wonders what this exceptional talent still has to learn when so much is already artistically harmonised on this carefully conceived recording. It is clever that Anna Schultsz puts all her potential at the service of one theme on her first CD. We are talking about the specific Francophone musical culture that has emancipated itself from the oppressive legacy of German Romanticism since the end of the 19th century. It is precisely because of this that these bravura pieces by Maurice Ravel, César Franck, Gabriel Fauré and Eugène Ysaÿe soar to such atmospheric intensity.

The young, highly motivated interpreter can also be relied upon in this final 'acid test'. In future, it is up to her to plunge into many more artistic adventures with curiosity and an open mind.

In the Sonata by Ysaÿe, for example, which concludes the CD, she does not shy away from youthfully intense and also quite artistically accentuated playing, but that is not all: over long stretches she develops the thoughts wrapped up in the music into an eloquent musical presentation.
